Ensemble Expectations

Attendance is mandatory! This includes being *on time* to all scheduled events. Being on time means being prepared to PLAY at the designated time, not walking in the door. To that end, you should arrive 15 minutes early to be ready to fulfill your obligations on time. Any conflicts need to be worked out with the staff immediately, so be proactive about your schedule as soon as possible. A **Three Ring Binder** with plastic sleeves will hold this handbook (including calendar), your exercise packet, a pencil, music, and drill for the show.

The Westhill High School Winter Percussion Ensemble will be treated as a professional percussion ensemble and in turn we expect professional behavior from all members. It is of supreme importance that we continually look after our equipment, and our responsibilities as contributing members of the ensemble.

There are two facets of improvement in any musical endeavor: practice and rehearsal. Practice is done at home to work on learning the music and refining the technique. Rehearsal is where we all come together to put that practice time together and learn to succeed as a group.

Care for Your Health

At no time should anyone play while hurt without us knowing about it. If you suspect a physical problem due to your playing, you MUST inform us immediately. We are not doctors, but if something can be done for you we will take care of it.

Care for Your Schoolwork

The Westhill High School Instrumental Music Department requires that students maintain a 2.3 or "C" grade point average. Students may be placed on probation with a 1.8 GPA, wherein a program will be designed by the Director and Guidance Counselor to assist this student to raise their academic standing. All aspects of this program must be met for the student to remain eligible. All students must be enrolled as full-time students (4 Carnegie units of work or more) to be eligible to participate in the music department.

Care for the Group

There are many parts of this activity that go way beyond playing and marching. Far more important is how well you work with the group, how well you interact with others from different backgrounds, different ability levels, different ages, and different experience levels. We are all in this together and you have to take care of each other no matter what. Especially being a group that spends so much time together throughout the season, each member needs to be able to trust those around them. Be a positive and trustworthy part of this circle. Be helpful, be sensitive, but be a motivator too. Keep in touch with each other and the staff, practice every day and be prepared to swallow your pride if necessary (we all have those moments, from the section leader on down!).

Financial Obligations

Dues for the season are \$300. This goes to cover uniform costs, staff, the performance mat, props, and various other items that are vital to the group's success. There will also be a fee for the Dayton, OH trip, which is where our World Championships are held. We are working to keep this cost as low as possible, but it currently looks to be approximately \$550. However, there are MANY fundraising opportunities to alleviate these costs. Members in the past have fundraised their entire financial obligations, so it is possible! Dues should be paid by December 31, and checks may be made payable to "WHSBPA".

MEMBER ATTENDANCE CONTRACT

In order for the Westhill High School Winter Percussion Program to achieve the highest level of performance excellence, attendance at all rehearsals and performances is mandatory. A parent or guardian must submit any potential conflicts with rehearsals or performances. It is important for students to be on time and ready to begin (instruments, music, and equipment on person, dressed appropriately) at the designated starting time. It is important to note; in order to start on time the student must arrive a few minutes prior to rehearsal.

The only acceptable excuses for missing rehearsals or performances are:

- documented illness
- calendar religious holiday
- death in the family

Emergencies constituted by *extreme extenuating* circumstances not covered above are subject solely to the discretion of the director. No absences will be considered excused if documented *after* a given rehearsal/performance date.

Westhill High School Instrumental Music Department CODE OF CONDUCT

The Westhill High School Instrumental Music Department believes that our student performers have a responsibility to provide a positive image to our community and peers at all times, regardless of location (classroom, rehearsal, visiting other schools, etc.). Our performers are expected to conduct themselves in accordance with this code and with the rules and regulations governing the student body at large.
